Survival is more essential than health for Croydon's vulnerable asylum seekers



Healthwatch Croydon, published its Refugees and Asylum Seekers: The Health and Wellbeing of those in Croydon report in December, based on the experiences of over 100 asylum seekers in Croydon of all ages, as well as those working in organisations on the front line.

Our report found that single adults without access to benefits and accommodation can find life very difficult. They are vulnerable, at risk and some have experienced exploitation, violence, malnutrition and constant tiredness - for them survival is more essential than health.

Issues raised included service accessibility, information and advice, and language difficulties. Healthwatch Croydon made recommendations calling for better support and access, clearer information and advice and more understanding.

Homeless people have the right to healthcare

One of the results of publishing our Asylum Seekers report, and then tabling this at Croydon's Health and Wellbeing Board, is that it created some discussions with health providers. We got some relevant feedback on services changes taking place.

We made a point that some homeless asylum seekers did not know that they can register at GPs without an address, which can act as an access point to others services. NHS Croydon CCG said that NHS Healthy London Partnership have launched a 'My right to access healthcare' card scheme which will run across London in December.



The plastic cards are designed to be carried by people who are homeless across London, including people who sleep rough, live in hostels, sleep on family and friend's sofas, or who are chronically insecurely housed. They can be used to remind GP
