What is Asset Based Community Development

ABCD stands for Asset-Based Community Development and it refers to a type of community development.

ABCD challenges the traditional deficit-based approach that tries to solve urban and rural development problems by focusing on the needs and deficiencies of individuals, neighbourhoods, villages, schools etc.

It is a lens through which we can support citizens and practitioners to effect more community driven development and to validate and celebrate that which is already happening.

(Nurture Development)

What is Asset Based Community Development?

ABCD supports citizens committed to the development of effective community alternatives to institutional responses. It builds on the work of those who are passionate about reducing institutionalisation. It is based on the belief that people primarily want a life not a service and that the best way to get a 'good life' is by increasing interdependency in communities.

(Nurture Development)

ABCD sees the world as glass 'half full'

Neighbourhood

'The optimum scale at which to do Asset Based Community Building is in a neighbourhood as defined by local people (not to be confused with an electoral ward) of approximately 3,000-5,000'

Community is at the heart




Steps Community Builders take

- As a Community Builder we walkabout in a neighbourhood finding local Community Connectors
- Find and connect passions finding out what local people care enough about to act on
- Asset Mapping identify local skills, talents, groups and organisations
- From passion to action hold an ideas fair to agree what can be done to make the community ever stronger
- HOLD COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE
- Match Funds not a grant and other external resources can help the activity already started
- Celebrate the shared vision should be celebrated and disseminated widely


